From Your Principal

Dear Lincoln Families,

We monitor attendance daily and there seems to be an on-going issue with students coming to school late. Even coming in 1 minute or 2 minutes or even 5 minutes late, hinders your child's start of the day. It is very important that they are at school on time every day. The gates open at 8:00 every morning with a free breakfast. Here are a few tips to help get your child to school on time daily.

1. Map out a schedule for morning family routines and have everyone on board with them.
2. Choose outfits the night before
3. Find shoes the night before
4. Do homework the night before
5. Have a backpack ready to go the night before
6. Prepack a lunch (if getting a home lunch) the night before
7. Get the kids to bed on time—give a bedtime of no later than 9:00 pm
8. Invest in several alarm clocks
9. Keep breakfast simple—eat at school ☺

By following these simple steps your mornings will go smoother, children will be at school on time, they will feel better about themselves, not feel overwhelmed by missing class time, and they won't have to serve a detention.

Priority Transitional/Kindergarten Registration March 5-23

Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten will require Physical Exam for school entry, up to date immunization records, Oral Health Assessment, birth certificate (passport or parent affidavit of student age), parent/guardian photo ID, proof of residency within Lincoln Unified School District (2 bills dated within 30 days or rental agreement dated within 30 days or rental agreement and 1 piece of current mail dated within 30 days Lincoln USD staff may ask for additional documentation or call to confirm residency or 2 pieces of correspondence from a government agency dated within 30 days).

After School Education & Safety (ASES) Placement Procedures For 2018-2019 School Year

Lincoln Unified School District provides the ASES program to students 1st - 6th grade (1st - 8th at Tully C Knoles) immediately following the end of the school day Monday - Friday until 6pm. During priority enrollment period (March 5-March 23, 2018), all families will be notified that they may pick up a pre-registration form for the ASES program. This form MUST be completed and received by Friday, March 23, 2018 by the ASES program at your child's school site.

All applications will be placed into a database and randomization in numerical order by family (we must receive an application for every child). Using this numerical listing, all spaces for the ASES program will be filled. Families will receive a letter by mail, in April stating if they have been placed in the program or on our waiting list. Priority will be given to current families, including siblings, in the program, as well as teacher/administrator referral due to academic or high need. Every family must apply every school year.

A parent or guardian who receives a letter stating their child(ren) are in the program for the 2018-2019 school year MUST attend a Mandatory Meeting at their school site to complete a full application and attend an orientation. Students who do not have a parent or guardian at this mandatory meeting will be placed on the waiting list. These meetings will be scheduled in mid-April and early May.

The program does have some very important requirements:

- Students must attend the program everyday they are in school and are only allowed 5 unexcused absences.
- Good behavior and cooperation are required from every student in order to remain in the program.
- Parents, students, and staff must sign a Program Contract that outlines specific expectations and reasons for dismissal.
